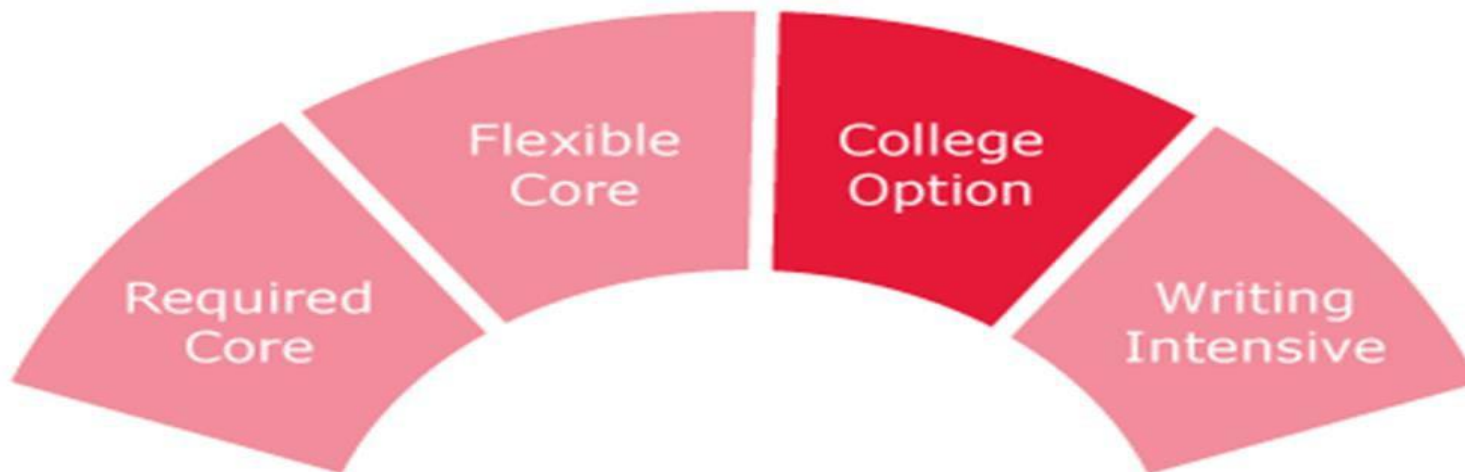


# Your QC Bachelor's Degree

All College Option courses must be completed in residency at Queens College.



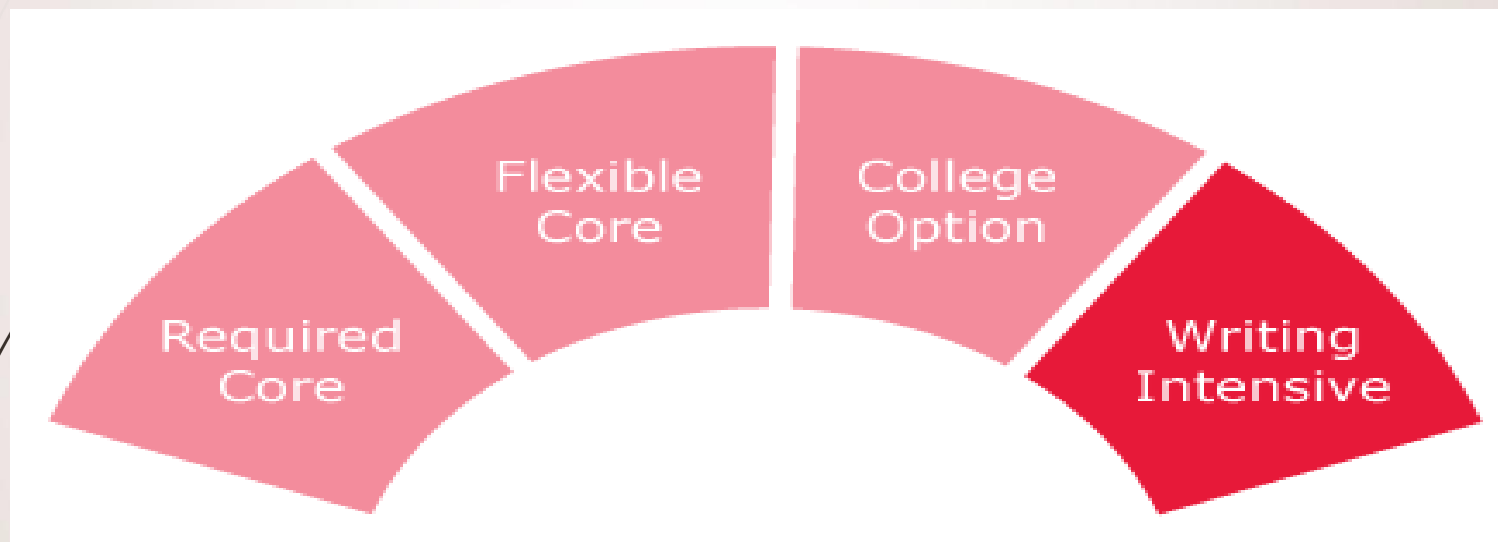

# Your QC Bachelor's Degree

## *Writing Intensive Requirement*

### QC Core Requirements (Pathways)

Cannot use Pass/ No Credit Grading Option for any courses applying to Pathways



- Students must complete **two Writing – Intensive “W” courses.**
- At least one "W" must be completed in residency at QC.
- English 110 is a prerequisite for all "W" courses.
- “W” courses can often overlap with General Education categories, as well as some majors and minors.

General Education requirements may be taken in any order if the pre-requisite requirement(s) is/are satisfied. \*It is better to first choose which two upper (300-level) electives interest you and, then, look at what lower their pre-requisites. This will help you determine which lower electives to take first that satisfy pre-requisite electives you want to take. PSYCH 214, 221, 232, and 243 serve as pre-requisites for many upper electives.

\*\*\* If a Literature course is taken with a VW it will count towards Literature and one Writing Intensive Unit.

\*\*\*General Electives: Students may complete general electives by taking courses in (most) departments or programs they choose; however, depending on the course program, students may need departmental permission and/or pre-requisite courses. Electives may be used to supplement the chosen major (an English major may want to take a course in French or Italian literature) or to fulfill interest in a different area (a Music major may be interested in the study of theater). Students are encouraged to use available electives to complete a dual major minor, prerequisites for graduate or professional school, or complete an internship, experiential learning, or other career-related activity. Students are encouraged to use their available general electives wisely and focus on coursework that will assist them personally, academically and professionally.

# Your QC Bachelor's Degree

## *Electives*

### QC General Electives

Can use Pass/No Credit for electives unless dual majors or minors.



- In order to graduate you must complete a minimum of **120 credits**.
- Depending on the size of your major, you may have a small or a large number of elective credits to fulfill.
- This area of the degree is a great opportunity to further develop your knowledge and skills set by supplementing your studies with practical experiences such as *internships* and *study abroad*.

# Stay on Track towards your QC Bachelor's Degree

# Immunization Information

## MMR/MEN IMMUNIZATION RECORDS

Before submitting your **MMR/MEN [Immunization Records](#)** login to your **CUNYfirst account – Student Service Center** and view the **holds section**. Only students entering Queens College from a high school outside of the NYC DOE must submit their MMR records or one form of Acceptable Proof of Immunity. For a complete list, refer to page one of the Immunization Record form.

All students (**regardless of age**) must complete the [meningitis response form](#). This information can also be self-managed through your CUNYfirst account.

# Graduate With Honors!

## General College Honors

- Requires a minimum 3.5 GPA.  
Keep In Mind: Most graduate schools accept a minimum of 3.0 GPA
- Complete a minimum of 45 credits in QC
- Pass/No Credit (P/NC) grades are not counted towards the 45 local credits

# Financial Aid

- Maintain full-time credit load. Aim to complete **15 credits** per semester/30 per academic year.
- Courses taken must apply towards degree requirements.
- Do not repeat courses taken previously. Discuss with an advisor first.
- Maintain acceptable GPA (minimum 2.0) & demonstrate *Satisfactory Academic Progress* (SAP), which is credit completion.
- Last day to add course(s) for Financial Aid Certification –  
**Tuesday, January 31, 2023**
- When in doubt, speak with an academic or financial aid advisor.

## Excelsior Scholarship Application

Putting Students First

The Excelsior Scholarship, in combination with other student financial aid programs, allows students to attend a CUNY college tuition-free.

**In order to apply, students must meet eligibility requirements, including:**

- Be residents of New York State
- Plan to attend a CUNY or SUNY college or university in pursuit of a two-year or four-year degree
- Be on track to graduate on time with an Associate's Degree in two consecutive years or a Bachelor's Degree in four consecutive years

# The Billing Process

- Once you are registered for courses your tuition bill will be generated. You will receive an email to your QC email account (*Office 365*) informing you of the bill due date, which is based on your initial date of registration.  
**Please note: Tuition Bills are **not** mailed to your home.**
- **View your tuition bill and applied Financial Aid in your Self-Service/Student Service Center page on CUNYfirst.**
- You are held financially and academically responsible once you are registered for classes. **Should your intention change to attend QC, you must drop your classes. Non-payment will not drop your classes.**
- Late fees will be assessed when adding/swapping courses after the semester has begun.

# QC Technology: Accounts and Access



All students entering QC must claim their “**QC Username**” account through the College’s “**CAMS**” system. This allows for access to the school’s computers, Wi-Fi on campus, and obtaining your college ID card, as well as other college web-based applications



**Register for classes, view and pay your tuition bill**, check final grades, sign-up for CUNY Alert, use Blackboard, DegreeWorks, e-Permit, as well as other services
