We are excited to report that two of our BALA students were awarded first prize in the Blackstone Launchpad Pitch Competition, which is an annual competition asking students to present an idea for a new business with the objective of convincing investors that the idea will prove successful. After identifying a market

problem and proposing a solution, Tova Kaplan and Shaina Davis pitched their idea—Aero Bend, which

"leverages urban wind currents to generate electricity using innovative wind turbines, offering a sustainable energy solution for city buildings to comply with Local Law 97." Tova and Shaina were awarded \$10,000.00 for their idea. Of note, one of our faculty members, **Philip Adsetts**, sat on the panel of judges. Of the finalists, he wrote: "I was especially impressed with the enthusiasm shown by the groups and the level of work that they put into their pitches. The group that won stood out both for their proposal, which included several analyses they learned in their BALA courses, and for the polish of their presentation." Congratulations to Tova and Shaina, and kudos to all our BALA faculty for playing a small part, through their BALA courses, in helping prepare these young women for this competition.

Not to be outdone by the successes of our students, BALA faculty can also boast accolades. **Tariqua Morrison**, BALA instructor of Law and Ethics of Business, was recently honored with the Distinguished Public Service Award by the Guy R. Brewer Democratic Club.
