A proportional combination of teaching and nonteaching overload **\*\*** 

(210 minus the assigned teaching hours) divided by .6 equals the number of non-teaching hours that may be assigned (this formula is for the entire academic year) For example, the faculty member has a multiple for two three-credit courses.

(210 - 90)/.6 = 120/.6 = 200

The faculty member could work 200 non-teaching hours for the year but would be limited to 150 per semester.

\*The 18 or 24 classroom contact hour workload can worked during the Fall semester, the Winter intersession, and the Spring semester if there is agreement between the faculty member and the college. Substitute faculty's workload shall be an additional 3.0 contact hours.

**\*\*** Any hours over the 18 or 24 classroom contact hours require a request for a Multiple Position. Contact the Office of Academic Affairs. Remember untenured faculty cannot have a multiple position when using junior release time, and any multiple position for untenured faculty must be approved in advance by the President. In general, multiple positions for untenured faculty are strongly discouraged.

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
