### IPEDS Student Financial Aid Component Overview

#### Public Academic Reporters

Welcome to the Student Financial Aid (SFA) component of the U.S. Department of Education's Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS). The purpose of the SFA component is to collect information about financial aid provided to various groups of undergraduate students at your institution.

#### Changes to This Year's SFA Component

- Only one year of data will be collected for existing institutions. New institutions will need to report multiple years of data. Changes to prior years of data must be made in the Prior Year Revision System.
- SFA is now part of the Winter collection. The Winter collection will close for keyholders on February 6, 2013.
- In Part E (data for Group 4), Column 2 has been revised for clarity. It now more clearly matches with the data in Column 3.

##### Groups

Throughout this component, you will be asked to report information for different groups of students.

- **Group 1:** All undergraduate students
- **Group 2:** Of Group 1, full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking students

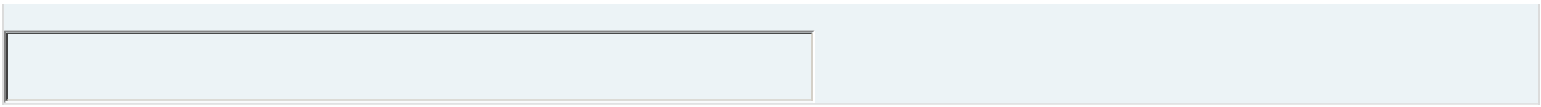
